The meeting therefore focuses on undergraduate (medical school) and graduate (residency and fellowship) Pathology education, and the practice of Pathology and Laboratory medicine in academic medical centers and hospitals. Content focuses on issues such as the development of educational programs and curricula for the training of medical students, residents, fellows, and senior pathologists on providing cost-effective, high-quality clinical service to patients. The meeting also features content related to research and implementation of cutting edge practice tools, such as diagnostics, genomic medicine, and bioinformatics; and their implications on future healthcare delivery, as well as workforce development and realignment to support current and new skill sets required to practice Pathology and Laboratory Medicine now and into the future.

The target audience is professionals (MD, DO, PhD) and others who serve as the academic, medical, scientific, and administrative leaders of departments of pathology and laboratory medicine in the United States and Canada.
