AAPath ADVOCACY ACTIONS UPDATE

From the desk of AAPath's Deputy Director, Lydia P. Howell, MD

As part of our advocacy mission, AAPath continues to follow and influence major issues facing academic pathology. On October 7, 2024, AAPath filed an <u>amicus brief</u> in support of the lawsuits filed by the Association for Molecular Pathology and the American Clinical Laboratory Association opposing the FDA's regulation of laboratory developed tests (LDTs) like medical devices. Arguments that we put forward in the brief include:

- FDA regulation impedes testing and creates unnecessary patient harm and deaths that affect everyone, but that disproportionately impacts vulnerable populations, such as people with cancer, rare diseases, and children, and exacerbate existing public health crises, with illustrative examples provided regarding the fentanyl epidemic, cancer diagnosis and treatment, and emerging pandemics, such as monkeypox and others;
- Costs of seeking FDA approval will force academic medical centers to reduce or abandon LDT development, leaving Americans with diminished opportunities for treatment and recovery;
- LDTs are already appropriately regulated to protect patient safety via CLIA;
- Certain modifications or updates to CLIA may be necessary as the field of medicine progresses.

An <u>amicus brief</u> with similar arguments has been filed by a coalition of other organizations (American Association of Bioanalysts, American Society of Clinical Pathology, Association

Lead, Inspire, Thrive: A Handbook for Medical School Department Chairs (and Other Leaders) for Diagnostic and Laboratory Medicine, American Society for Microbiology, and Infectious Diseases Society of America). The College of American Pathologists (CAP) also filed an <u>amicus brief</u> with some concerns expressed in other briefs, as well as a recommendation for a solution like the previously proposed VALID Act, which AAPath has not previously supported. CAP also recommends against a decision based on the practice of medicine.

Next steps in this legal battle with the FDA include filing of briefs by the plaintiffs and defendant by the end of 2024. The court will hear the case after the first of the year, and it may take several months for a final decision to be made. We will continue to follow this important issue closely.

 Speaking of regulation, two interesting articles were published in JAMA in October regarding FDA and FTC regulation of artificial intelligence in healthcare. Since AI is emerging as an important tool for pathology practice and laboratory services, we will be following this issue closely, too. NEW: VICE CHAIRS FOR RESEARCH AFFINITY GROUP

AAPath Council has formerly approved the creation of this NEW Affinity Group to better serve and support the academic research mission of Pathology departments. The Vice Chairs for Research Affinity Group will be overseen by the AAPath Research Committee.

- Create a network connecting the designated Research representative (such as Vice Chairs) from academic pathology departments.
- Generate a discussion of common topics/issues to understand better and discuss how to address them.
- Publish papers on projects from the group's activities.




