AAPath Advocacy Priorities for 2025

Under the leadership of Steven Kroft, MD (Medical College of Wisconsin), Chair of the AAPath Advocacy Committee, the 2025 AAPath Advocacy Priorities approved by AAPath Council are now posted at: <u>www.academicpathology.org/statements</u>. The priorities remain focused on the academic missions of education, practice and research, while adjusting to the evolving political and regulatory landscape at the national level.

Other Advocacy Updates

From the desk of AAPath's Deputy Director, Lydia P. Howell, MD

2025 is off to a big start. Not only is it a new year, but there is new leadership in the White House, which will likely bring many changes for academic medicine and pathology, including lots of opportunity for advocacy nationally and on the local level, especially in your own academic health center. Here is what is on the horizon:

• New opportunities for GME slots on the horizon: At the end of 2024, the Senate Finance Committee issued draft legislation to increase Medicare-supported GME slots. Many of us in pathology have been discouraged from accessing new GME slots in the past, since this expansion has previously targeted rural care and primary care. In this new draft, however, pathology may have more opportunity since only 25% of the 5000 slots in the draft legislation is earmarked for primary care and 15% for psychiatry. You may want to start advocating with your own institution about gaining some of these GME slots for your department -- the <u>U.S. Physician Workforce Data Dashboard | AAMC</u> provides excellent data that you can use to make your case, since there is large predicted gap for pathologists. Regarding the rural care requirement, many medical schools and academic medical centers educate physicians, including pathologists, needed to serve rural areas, especially state-supported medical schools who are expected to serve their state's rural population. Private institutions may also make the case that rural areas of their state need their pathology trainees.

- Immigration policy impacting trainees: International medical graduates are important to the pathologist workforce, therefore new executive orders signed by President Trump limiting immigration raise concerns. The impact may not be as substantial as feared, since the AAMC has pointed out that these limits are far less than the President's 2017 travel ban.
- Diversity, equity, and inclusion and accountability (DEIA): President Trump has rescinded former President Biden's previous executive orders addressing systemic racism, inequities in the Federal government, gender identity and sexual orientation, discrimination, DEIA, as well as initiatives to advance educational equity and economic opportunities for Hispanic, Native American and black students. Federal agencies have 60 days to terminate all DEI activities, offices, positions, related grants or contracts, as well as all DEI performance requirements within their respective agencies or departments. AAPath is closely following these events. Notably, as a non-federal entity, AAPath's DEI activities can continue and potentially fill some of the gap for our members, if schools sunset their own DEI programs.
- FDA regulation of LDTs like medical devices: This ever-present advocacy issue continues in its current form despite speculation that this rule will go away, there have been no executive orders or other events prompting change. Academic clinical laboratories therefore need to continue their preparations since all deadlines are still in place with the first coming up this May. AAPath is planning the next LDT webinar for early March with speakers from AAMC and AMP who will give us an update on what's ahead, including any policy changes or progress on the lawsuit filed by AMP and ACLA. - NIH reform and the value of research: Gaining more NIH funding for academic
 pathology departments was a driving reason for the founding of AAPath almost 60 years
 ago, and remains an important issue for us today. Therefore, AAPath is closely following
 with our partners discussions regarding NIH reform. To be effective in this advocacy,
 involvement of our members on a local and national level will be needed, including their
 schools and academic health centers. The AAMC has prepared a helpful infographic that
 you may want to download to help you better communicate the value of research to your
 constituents.

This is clearly an important time for advocacy. AAPath will continue to follow these important issues which involve all academic missions so that we can best support the work of academic pathology departments. We look forward to your participation.




