




### Q7 Is your program ACGME-accredited?:


### Q8 Program length:





### Q9 Average number of positions in the program per year (for this program only):











# Q13 Approximately how many times, over the last 5 years, has the program failed to fill a position you wished to fill due to inability to recruit an acceptable applicant?





### Q14 How has this undesired vacancy rate changed over the last 10 years?





### Q15 In the last 5 years, has your fellowship program had any unexpected re-openings, due to a fellow accepting a position, but later dropping out?





# Q16 If YES, what reason(s) did the accepted fellows give for dropping out (select ALL that apply)?





### Q17 How often has your program had an unexpected reopening/drop-out?





### Q18 How has this unexpected reopening rate changed over the last 10 years?



# Q19 Over the past 5 years, how many fellows have withdrawn from your program in the following timelines?





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



### Q21 When do you typically BEGIN formally offering fellowship positions to selected applicants?





# Q22 How often have you lost a desired applicant primarily because of timing (i.e. they have already accepted an earlier offer)?





# Q23 How often have applicants rejected your offer primarily because it is too early and they are waiting on other programs that have not yet made decisions?





# Q24 Do you think the current recruitment process for pathology fellowships should be changed?











# Q28 Do you plan to use virtual interviews in upcoming recruitment years, even after in-person interviews are allowed?





# Q31 Would you support a pathology-wide agreement to conduct all interviews virtually?









# Q34 Are you in favor of a formal surgical and surgical subspecialty pathology fellowship match program?





### Q35 Are you in favor of a pathology-wide unified timeline for fellowship recruitment (e.g. a common date for making offers)?





# Q36 Are you in favor of a unified timeline for surgical and surgical subspecialty pathology fellowship recruitment (e.g. a common date for making offers)?






