Chair, Department of Pathology

The Ohio State University College of Medicine and Wexner Medical Center seek an exceptional academic physician with proven leadership skills to serve as the next chair for the Department of Pathology. This is an exciting time for a new leader to join our forward-thinking organization. Across Ohio State campuses, growth, energy, and investment are evident in every aspect of the tripartite mission; a culture of transformation is pervasive. The Ohio State University College of Medicine and Wexner Medical Center are undergoing a \$3 billion expansion to include a new inpatient hospital tower, Interdisciplinary Health Sciences Center, and comprehensive Innovation District on West Campus to promote and expand interdisciplinary research and innovation.

The Ohio State University Department of Pathology encompasses the tripartite mission of clinical care, research, and education, with 70 physician and clinical PhD faculty, 15 experimental faculty, 30 pediatric pathology faculty and nearly 180 staff. The Clinical Pathology branch includes Chemistry/Toxicology, Coagulation, Flow Cytometry, Hematology, Hematopathology, Microbiology and Transfusion Medicine/Apheresis. The Molecular Pathology branch includes Molecular Genetics and Cytogenetics. The Anatomic Pathology branch includes Autopsy, Cytopathology, Dermatopathology, Neuropathology and subspecialized surgical pathology divisions. In addition, the department has a community division that serves five community hospitals, two primarily through digital- and tele-pathology. The Graduate Medical Education programs in the department include a residency program (16 residents) and seven pathology fellowships.

The Department of Pathology is a leader in digital and computational pathology and has a fully integrated and automated, end-to-end clinical workflow with nine scanners in the histology laboratory. Over 3.2 million slides from more than 300,000 clinical cases have been scanned and archived with current scanning of 2,500 slides each day. Applications of this system include presenting pathology at multidisciplinary tumor conferences, performing digital pathology consultations, teaching, and validating and implementing artificial intelligence applications for clinical and research use.



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The next chair will build on the accomplishments of the current department by increasing its presence in Columbus, the Midwest and the national/international stage through driving innovative clinical service and research while further advancing the academic mission. The successful candidate will possess the ability to successfully lead physicians, researchers and other health professionals while embracing the values of inclusiveness, diversity, and excellence. Qualified candidates must possess an MD, DO or MD/PhD and board certification in Anatomic or Clinical Pathology. They must be licensed or eligible for licensure to practice medicine in the state of Ohio and qualify for faculty appointment as associate professor or professor. Proven and substantial clinical and operational leadership experience is required, as is the ability to be a collaborative thought leader in a large, multi-faceted academic medical center.

The Ohio State University College of Medicine, with more than 5,000 learners, is the only academic medical center in central Ohio. Ranked as the 28th Best Medical School – Research, 40th Best Medical School – Primary Care, and 13th Most Diverse Medical School by *U.S. News & World Report*, it is known nationwide for curricular innovation, pioneering research, and outstanding patient care at The Ohio State University Wexner Medical Center. With more than 2,600 faculty members, the college comprises 20 clinical departments, eight basic science departments and a School of Health and Rehabilitation Sciences.
